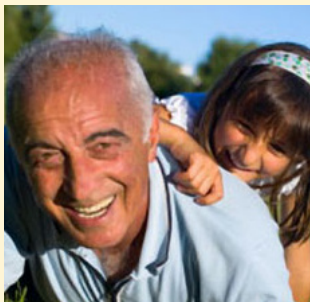

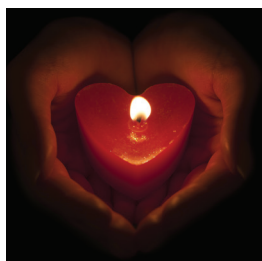
DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., VISIONARY OF THE BELOVED COMMUNITY:

As his birthday and civil rights leadership are celebrated Monday, January 16, we reflect on Dr. King's vision of the Beloved community for our world today.
