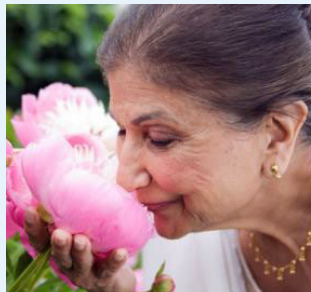

* **Howard Washington Thurman** (November 1899-April 1981): An American author, philosopher, theologian, educator and civil rights leader, Thurman had a leading role in many social justice movements and organizations of the twentieth century. Thurman was a key mentor to leaders within the civil rights movement, including Martin Luther King Jr.
