
#### MARCH 17 - FEAST OF ST. PATRICK

Patrick was born to wealthy parents over 1,600 years ago in the British Isles. When he was a teenager on his



father's estate he was kidnapped by pirates and taken to pagan Ireland where he was sold as a slave. After six years he escaped by ship and returned home. As a slave. Patrick's spiritual life deepened. He wrote, "The love of God grew in me more and more as did my faith."

Patrick recognized God's

call to Ireland. He studied for the priesthood. Later he was ordained a bishop and sent to Ireland. His mission there lasted 30 years. During that time he established monasteries, churches and schools throughout Ireland. He died Mar 17, 461 A.D.

#### MARCH 19 – FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH

Joseph was a carpenter, who treasured working with wood. Not being able to afford a lamb to bring to the



Temple, he brought a simple offering of two turtle doves. Joseph came from royal lineage, a descendant of King David. He was a compassionate, caring man who dearly loved Mary and Jesus. With Mary he searched three days for Jesus. Annually he took his family to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover. Since Joseph is not recorded

in Jesus' public life, historians believe Joseph probably died before Jesus entered public ministry. Joseph is the patron of a happy death because he likely died with Jesus and Mary at his side. May we also be surrounded loved ones when we leave earth and enter eternal life.


From the cloud came a voice ...Listen...


