Then they said to each other, "Did not our hearts burn within as he talked and explained the scriptures to us?"

– Luke 24:32

One of my favorite pictures is the scene of three robed figures walking along a dirt road, with the sun breaking through trees and clouds. The man in the middle with his hand upraised as he talks, seems to fascinate the other two.

In Sunday's gospel the Easter story features two disciples who think everything is over. They have just experienced a great loss. They had hoped Jesus would have set Israel free. Their conversation reveals sadness and confusion over the death of Jesus. Then they encounter Jesus, unrecognized, though walking with them. They welcome this stranger, who interprets their dreadful loss, in the light of the Scriptures. In the evening shared with them, Jesus repeats what he did at the Last Supper. Then in the breaking of the bread, the two recognize Jesus. In the instant of recognition, the disciples know the risen Jesus. Then Jesus vanishes


from their sight. The disciples race back to Jerusalem to tell the rest of their community about their meeting Jesus. With great joy, the two celebrate Jesus presence, life giving and real as they walked, talked, wondered and sat at table with Jesus.

Like the two disciples, we meet Jesus in our own present day experience. In our faith-life we see our own belief and unbelief, our questions, actions, and emotions in this story. Jesus' words and deeds teach every generation about his presence with and among them.

Each day Jesus listens to us, questions us, guides and uses the Scripture to lead us to deeper relationship with him and others. Then they said to each other, "Did not our hearts burn within as he talked and explained the scriptures to us?"
