

WATER, AIR, FIRE

Last Friday, we celebrated Earth Day.

Every day is a celebration of God's created earth.

We reflect upon three elements of our earth
nurturing our life with God and with each other.

WATER: BAPTISM

With gratitude we remember the moment of our baptism, so as to live the great gift we received with greater awareness. – Pope Francis

Water, a necessity of life, is poured on our heads in Baptism as we become sharers in the life our Creator, our Redeemer and the Holy Spirit FOREVER. On Holy Saturday we prayed for God's blessing on our bowl of water and dipped our hand in it as a reminder of our baptism. During these 50 days of Easter the bowl of water is in a place of honor. The fountain of water in the sanctuary recalls the sacredness of baptism.

AIR: THE BREATH OF GOD

We are participating in a study sponsored by Washington University and Metropolitan Congregation United (MCU). A new device on the top of the side Rectory porch is an air quality monitor. This monitor measures the air quality in and around our parish and allows us to pull data to see what the pollutant level is and what is polluting our air.
