MAAFA – Kiswahili for "Great Disaster" is a traditional procession memorializing lives lost during the Middle passage of the Atlantic slave trade. The MAAFA will be led by Archbishop Mitchell T. Rozanski and other faith leaders, beginning with a prayer service at the old Cathedral, 209 Walnut St. and journeying to historical downtown St. Louis sites related to the slave trade and local enslavement of Africans. Please join us as we attest to our broken past and ask God to lead us on a path of acknowledgement, reconciliation, forgiveness, and healing. For those unable to attend, the MAAFA Procession will be live-streamed on the Archdiocese of St. Louis Facebook page.
