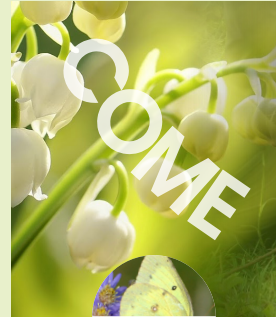

DACA (DEFERRED ACTION FOR CHILDHOOD ARRIVALS): As we celebrate the birth of our country we remember our immigrant ancestors and immigrants today. DACA is an immigration policy that allows some individuals after being brought to the United States as children to receive a renewable two-year period of deferred action from deportation and become eligible for a work permit in the U.S.

Archbishop Carlson responds to the Supreme Court decision to halt the termination of the policy: “I welcome the decision of the Supreme Court which found that the Trump Administration failed to follow the administrative procedure required to repeal the DACA program. I hope this may serve as an important step toward offering a permanent solution for Dreamers and affirming the human dignity of these brothers and sisters in Christ.”

NEW PRIESTS APPOINTMENTS


