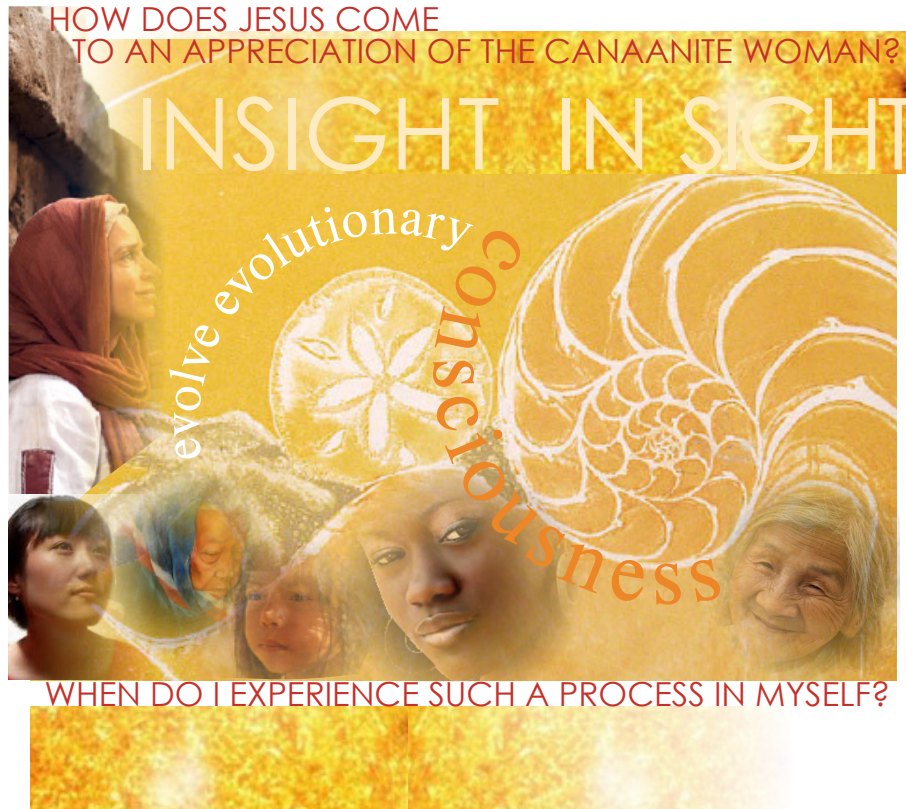

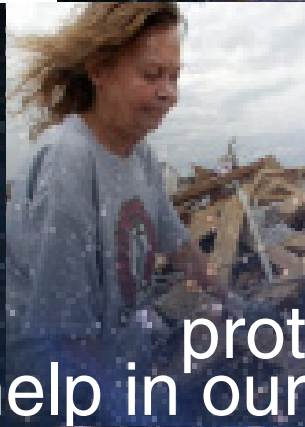


MISSION:
