# THE GREAT SHEMA

The Pharisees approach
Jesus with a rhetorical
question: "which is the
greatest commandment?"
This is a teaching for all
Jews; Jesus would have
memorized it when he
was three years old: "You
shall love your God, with
all your heart, with all your



soul, and with all your mind." This is the first commandment uttered from the lips of Moses in the Book of Deuteronomy (6:4), beginning with "Shema," which is translated, "Hear!"

Jesus offers the second commandment, to connect the first commandment to its measure. We must love our neighbor as our self. Our neighbor is our self; we are all connected as beloved children of God. We are one body, one in Christ. The way to know we are loving our God completely is to ask, "How are the widow, the orphan and the stranger faring in my midst?"

We are called to love God wholeheartedly, with our whole being. When we love boldly, we are attentive to the voice of the poor. Who waits for me to respond today? Our love of neighbor mirrors our love of God; our love of God deepens each time we love our neighbor.

october 31 ALL HALLOW'S EVE: All Hallows Eve is the day before All Hallows' Day, also known as All Saints' Day. The church traditionally held a vigil on All Hallows' Eve when worshippers would prepare themselves with prayer and fasting prior to the feast day of All Saints. The name derives from the Old English 'hallowed' meaning holy. It is often connected to the familiar word Hallowe'en.
