
MAY 15: FEAST OF ST. ISADORE, PATRON SAINT

THE ASCENSION OF JESUS TWO ENCOUNTERS WITH THE RISEN CHRIST

Jesus of Nazareth, the Risen Christ, divine and human, ascends to "heaven," securing a place in heaven for all humanity. The Risen Christ accompanies us in our journey as disciples, here on earth, which is



eternally connected to heaven through the Spirit. Jesus, resurrected, appeared to the disciples in a variety of places and circumstances. It was important that the first witnesses could testify to the living Christ, the one who conquered death, is indeed risen. We sometimes say, "if only I could see the Risen Christ with my own eyes, then..." Then what?

Christ promises to be with us always; Christ has sent the Holy Spirit to dwell in us, to give us the same power which raised Jesus from the dead. Encounter with the Risen Christ, dwelling in us through the power of the Holy Spirit, is more profound than the encounter with Christ in the garden, on the beach or in the upper room.
