Recap of Last Sunday's Parish Assembly

Mission Possible:

S. Janice relayed that the number one comment when she met with Archbishop Carlson is that we need to grow our parish. Increasing the number of our members should also translate into increased tithes which will increase our financial stability as a parish.

To support our goal of increasing our parish base by 4 to 8 families this year, a welcome card was distributed. The card is designed as an easy way for all of us to invite others to come Most Holy Trinity. Examples of when to give a card is when we are having a special event, when someone seems interested in knowing more about where you go to church or when someone is asking for prayer.

Every Sunday when you arrive at church please place a bead into the glass jar to indicate how many cards you have given out that week. We hope to have at least 500 beads in the jar by the time Easter comes around!

Lent:

During Lent, a series of inserts inspired by Pope Francis' *Laudato Si* will be in the bulletin. The first one was distributed last Sunday. This will provide an ongoing focus for Lent in our community as a whole. In addition, the Parish Retreat on March 25 will also focus on these topics. Also, on Wednesday's there will be mass in the Rectory Chapel at 12:10 pm. Stations of the Cross are scheduled for the evening of March 31st.

Restructuring:

With the departure of Michael Kress from our parish staff, we have had one more change to address. To minimize disruption and to maintain continuity, Carol Nowak will be absorbing most of Michael's Mission Advancement responsibilities. A part-time individual to cover the administrative duties will need to be hired. While we have someone in mind, they have not yet accepted and we will be placing a want ad for the position.

Beyond Sunday:

First of all, the Archdiocese extends an apology for the Beyond Sunday letter that was sent out over Fr. Rich's signature. Fr. Rich as well as parish staff were totally unaware that this communication was being sent out. The Beyond Sunday campaign, (whose funds are primarily designated Catholic Education with a portion is given to the parish), is ending. The Archdiocese has kindly ask that all parishioners turn in a response. It is our hope that all will return their cards today. Thank you!

St. Louis Review:



Roof Update:

At our Fall Parish Assembly, we spoke the need for a total roof replacement. Fortunately after having estimates from roofers that specialize in slate and copper roofs, we have since found out that only our roof valleys need repair. This is a significantly lower amount that full replacement. It is still an expensive repair (approximately \$38,000), and we have applied for a grant from the Archdiocese to help defray a portion of the expense. We hope to hear in the coming weeks if we will be awarded funding. In the meantime, be assured that your support of buying a Club Trinity membership as well as the donations made in the yellow collection envelopes will fund this need. We will keep you updated on progress.
