





#### St. Rose Philippine Duchesne

This afternoon at 2:30 a Mass of Thanksgiving will be celebrated at the Cathedral Basilica in honor of the bicentennial of her arrival in St. Louis. She is the secondary patron of the Archdiocese of St. Louis. The diocese gathers to celebrate her life and faithful witness of this important saint in the history of the Archdiocese.

Sister Rose Duchesne entered the Visitation nuns in France 1805 and in 1818 came to America and founded her first house for her sisters which was a log cabin in St. Charles. She opened the first American free school west of the Mississippi. By 1828 she had established six houses for her missionary Sisters. At age 71 she began a school for the Indians at Sugar Creek. Her biographers stressed her courage in frontier conditions, her single mindedness in pursing her dream to serve the Indians and a comtemplative presence that was so evident among the Indians that they called her "The Woman who prays always." She was canonized in 1988
